Increase Your Rebate and Receive Additional Bill Credits

(Details Listed Below)

In addition to receiving a one-time rebate when you upgrade your HVAC equipment or water heater, you can also earn bill credits when you allow Harrison REMC to install an Energy Management switch on your air conditioner and/or water heater.

Co-ops around the country have found energy management programs to be an effective way to manage wholesale peak power costs. There is no cost to you for the installation of the switch and you can choose to have a switch installed on only your air conditioner, only your water heater, or on both appliances, which will maximize the bill credits you will receive.

What's in it for you?

| Second Air Conditioner | \$2.00 per month for June, July and Aug. |

There will be no bill credits given in the months of March, April, May, September, October and November, as little or no peak controlling will be done those months.

What is the Energy Management Program?

The Energy Management Program is an innovative program that puts technology to work to save energy. Cycling the water heaters and air conditioners or heat pumps of participating members throughout our service territory helps reduce the demand for electricity during hours of peak energy use.

How do I get started?

The program is free and a simple phone call is all it takes to have a switch installed on your water heater and air conditioner. (An example of the water heater switch is shown at right). Then, when energy use is at its peak a signal will be sent to cycle down the water heater and heating and cooling units for short periods of time. You'll still have plenty of hot water and the inside temperature of your home shouldn't be compromised. The good news is that you'll be saving energy, as well as helping out the environment, without having to do a thing.



Will I save money with this program?

Well, since your appliances are only cycled down for small periods of time the answer is no. But by getting as many people as possible to participate it helps reduce demand when energy is the most expensive, and that means we can help keep energy costs low as well as help reduce greenhouse emissions. So in the end we all benefit.

There are some eligibility criteria for having this switch installed in your home. If you check the box on the rebate form to receive the switch, you will be contacted by Harrison REMC to discuss your eligibility. Non-eligible installations for the Harrison REMC Energy Management Switch:

AC/HP cooling unit in:

- rental homes, unless owner approves
- single wide mobile homes
- homes with window AC/HP units
- homes with package AC/HP units (motel style)
- homes with crawl spaces that have water in them
- homes with crawl spaces that have items that block access to areas required for installation of the energy management switch
- homes with crawl spaces that pose health risks for installers
- two story homes with two AC/HP cooling units where the owner only wants the downstairs unit controlled
- homes where wire must be run through finished areas of the home (unless the homeowner approves)

Electric Water Heaters:

- smaller than 30 gallons
- the second unit of two water heaters installed in series
- a heat pump water heater
- rental unit electric water heater unless approved by the owner
- homes where wire must be run through finished areas of the home (unless the homeowner approves)
- homes on Time-of-Use rate (customers should just install a timer)
