

# 2026 Annual Meeting

## Minutes from the 87<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting

Harrison REMC held the 87th Annual Meeting on Monday, May 5th from 4 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. at the Harrison County Fairgrounds and May 6th from 11:30 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. at the REMC headquarters. All members received their annual meeting notice, election information, and registration card in the April Indiana Connection. Members were able to vote in one of four ways: 1) by mail, 2) at the REMC office, 3) annual meeting event at the fairgrounds, 4) and drive-thru event at the Harrison REMC office.

Upon registering, members were given a ballot, a short bio for each board candidate, 2024 annual meeting minutes and the 2024 financial report. Members were asked to approve the Annual Meeting minutes, financial report, and to vote for the candidates from District 2, 3, and 6.

A short informational meeting was held at the Harrison County Fairgrounds on Monday, May 5th, beginning at 5:50 p.m. REMC Board Chairman, David Poe welcomed the membership to the event and thanked all the employees for their dedication to serve the membership in 2024.

Chairman Poe recognized Brian Koetter for his 21 years of service on the REMC board. Director Brian Koetter chose not to run again for his district.

Attorney John Colin explained the director election, annual meeting notice, and how the Credential and Election Committee monitors the election.

CEO, David Lett stated that the cooperative was in a good financial position and passed its recent audit from Monroe Shine. He announced that in 2024, REMC refunded over \$1.8 million in capital credits to the membership.

Mr. Lett then informed the membership of the purchase of four acres of land near the corporate office to relocate the pole yard and construct a storage building for materials. Additionally, over the next few years, the board will consider a headquarters facility remodel.

A 6 minute video about the electric industry and what is currently happening at the cooperative was shown.

After tallying all ballots cast by the various methods described above, three Directors were elected: Pat Book (District 2) Craig Engleman (District 6) and Leah Huber (District 3). All three Directors were elected for a three (3) year term.

Members approved the 2024 annual meeting minutes and financial report.

At the combined events, 1,693 members registered and received a \$20 bill credit and a gift for attending.

Door prizes were drawn by Harrison REMC Credential & Election committee member on Tuesday evening, May 6th after the drive-thru event. Results of the election and door prizes were announced in the June 2025, Indiana Connection and were posted on the Harrison REMC website.






## Where Your Dollar Went in 2025
